

Why is electricity important in Denmark?

Electricity plays a vital role in modern society, and it will become increasingly important in future energy supply and the green transition. The Danish Energy Agency manages the legislation on the electricity market in Denmark.

How much does electricity cost in Denmark?

With the cost of electricity today in Denmark (East) it is 2.75 EUR cheaper to charge at the hours with the lowest price. How does Copenhagen get energy?
